- Paraprofessionals that will report progress to classroom teachers
- Reports from classroom teachers to parents on their child’s progress

Parents shall be responsible to support learning by:

- Ensuring their child attends school regularly, is well-rested, and ready to learn
- Promoting the value of learning, support at-home reading (minimum of 20 minutes daily for second grade) and monitoring homework completion
- Attending conferences, school functions and participating in parent meetings, as well as volunteering opportunities, if possible
- Supporting the discipline procedures of the school and view it as a growth instrument and in children’s long term interests by teaching them to accept responsibility for their actions

Students shall be responsible for:

- Recognizing that school and schoolwork is important and requires effort
- Completing homework, including daily reading at home (minimum of 20 minutes for second grade) and/or practicing mathematics skills at home
- Coming to school on time, ready to learn
- Being respectful to others and responsible learners
