For the past 32 years, the Naperville Police Department has partnered with the community to create, produce and distribute the Crime Prevention Calendar. The students' colorful artwork and impactful safety tips bring both youthful charm and practical application to the crime prevention messages we teach and practice each and every year. We enjoy being able to continue this tradition for your family to be able to plan their schedules with events and information for our community.

This past year, we have enhanced our commitment to crime prevention by resolving to make Naperville "A Safer Naper" by releasing a new safety theme each month to educate residents on how to prevent crime. Naperville is consistently lauded as one of the safest cities in the country, and we like to think that one of the reasons behind our success as a community is the constant involvement of residents in public safety every day. The deterrence of crime is very much a collaborative effort that starts with the education of our youngest residents and continues year-round with the participation of the entire community. Law enforcement agencies alone cannot keep a community safe, and the citizens of Naperville have long worked in partnership with the Naperville Police Department to educate each other and practice safe habits to enhance the quality of life in our great city. In the last year, our strong relationship with Naperville's public and private schools allowed us to schedule more than 300 safety presentations in elementary classrooms; our collaboration with residents resulted in the participation of nearly 45 neighborhoods in last year's National Night Out; and our strong connection with community groups led to more than 80 tours of the Naperville Police Department in just 12 months.

As you can see, Naperville has a tremendous history of collaborating for the betterment of the community. The calendar you hold in your hands is just one more tangible example, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the sponsors and partners who worked so diligently with us to produce this calendar: Naperville Community Unit School District 203, Indian Prairie School District 204, All Saints Catholic Academy, Bethany Lutheran School, Calvary Christian School, Saints Peter & Paul Catholic School, Saint Raphael School, Naperville Crime Stoppers, the Exchange Club of Naperville, and the City of Naperville.
