This past year, we have enhanced our commitment to crime prevention by resolving to make Naperville "A Safer Naper" by releasing a new safety theme each month to educate residents on how to prevent crime. Naperville is consistently lauded as one of the safest cities in the country, and we like to think that one of the reasons behind our success as a community is the constant involvement of residents in public safety every day. The deterrence of crime is very much a collaborative effort that starts with the education of our youngest residents and continues year-round with the participation of the entire community. In the last year, our strong relationship with Naperville's public and private schools allowed us to schedule more than 300 safety presentations in elementary classrooms; our collaboration with residents resulted in the participation of nearly 45 neighborhoods in last year's National Night Out; and our strong connection with community groups led to more than 80 tours of the Naperville Police Department in just 12 months.


