District 203 Graduation Requirements	Minimum College Admission Requirements (Varies by Institution – This is a guideline)
Communication Arts (English) – 4.0 credits	English – 4.0 credits
Mathematics – 3.0 credits (Including Algebra 1)	*Mathematics – 3.0 credits – through Algebra 2
Science – 2.0 credits	Science – 3.0 credits of lab science
Social Studies – 2.5 credits (including US Gov and US History)	Social Studies – 3.0 credits (emphasizing Gov’t and History)
Fine Arts – .5 credit	**Fine Arts, World and Classical Languages, CTE - varies
Career and Technical Education – 1.0 credit	*Colleges prefer students take 4 years of Math
Physical Education – 3.5 credits	**Some colleges require 2 years of Foreign Language, many do not. Some colleges require Fine Art, most do not. It will be important to check each Institution’s requirements for these areas.
Health Education – .5 credit (Sophomore year)
