Community

Naperville is a suburban community of over 144,000 residents. It is located thirty miles west of Chicago on I-88, the high-tech corridor of the western suburbs. The majority of residents are engaged in business, professional, managerial, and technical occupations.

School

Naperville Central High School is a public, four-year comprehensive high school with 243 certified staff members, a majority of whom have a Master's degree or beyond. The school day consists of eight 50-minute periods. All classes meet 5 days per week during two 18-week semesters. Naperville Central's enrollment for the 2014-15 school year is 2,911 including 741 freshmen, 709 sophomores, 725 juniors, 704 seniors and 32 transition students.

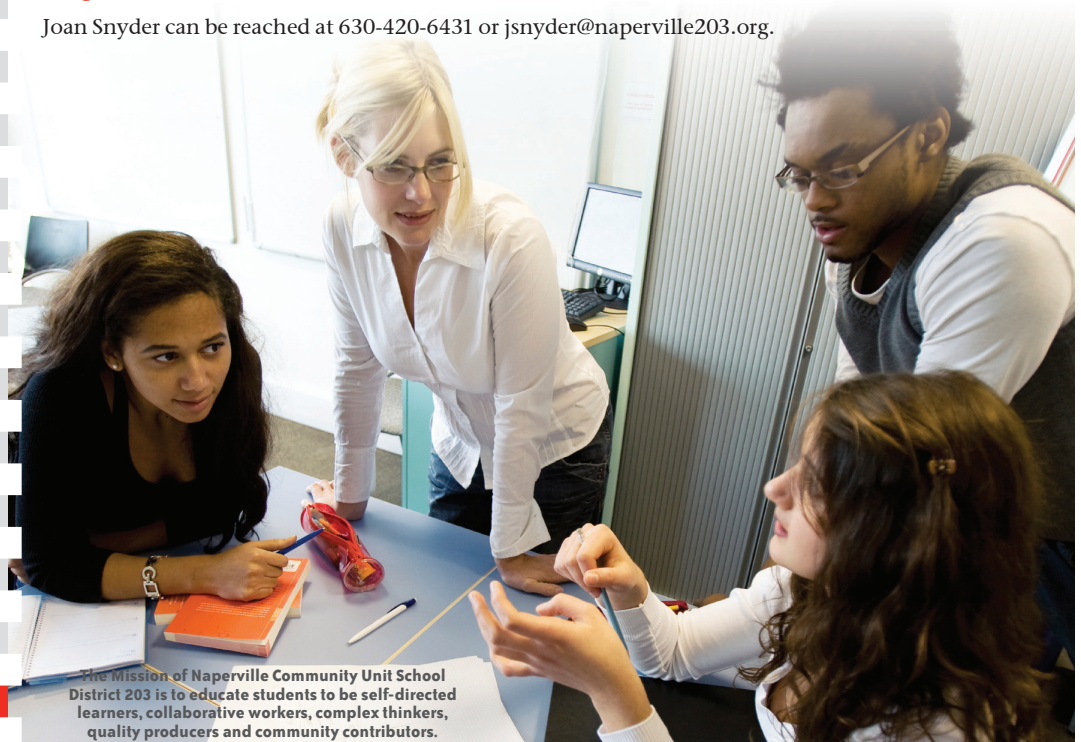
