To qualify for this award, at least 90% of a school's students must meet or exceed state standards in both reading and math for three consecutive years. In addition, each school must make all Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) targets in achievement, participation and attendance/graduation rate for the last two years. To have 15 of District 203's 21 schools meet this standard is a testament to the commitment and hard work of students, staff and community.
