


Accessing Chrome Browser History on a Student Chromebook

1. You will need the Username and Password of the account in question, Chromebook browser history is profile specific.
2. Log into the chromebook using the account in question.
3. Launch the chrome browser. With the browser window selected, hit Control+H to bring up the history viewer.
4. At the top of the History viewer window you may see multiple devices listed, these are all of the devices that have been logged into with this account. The default view shows account history as a whole, you may also view the history of individual devices from this page.
5. Each entry in the History viewer is a hyperlink, allowing you to click on the link to directly view any pages that are listed.
