

## Classroom

In the classroom students will learn many lessons that will help prepare them for driving. Our four units include The Driving Task, Controlling your Vehicle, Driving in Different Environments, and Being a Responsible Driver. Each unit covers a wide range of topics. Just a few examples include identifying street signs, lane markings and signals, how natural forces affect your vehicle while driving, and general car maintenance.

Students also take a field trip where they drive a vehicle on a closed course with impaired vision goggles to simulate the difficulty of driving under the influence. Students also hear from professionals on many important topics.

## Simulation

We have 12 brand new state of the art simulators which offer both automatic and manual transmission training lessons.

Our simulators offer over 120 hours of driving lessons and scenarios to improve each student's decision making process.

We have the capability to simulate day and night driving along with a variation of weather conditions and hazards.

# Behind the Wheel

Students will receive 12 behind the wheel driving lessons with a state certified driving instructor covering every driving situation and skill.

These skills include residential driving, turnabouts, backing, hill parking, angle and perpendicular parking, two and four lane roadways, expressway, city driving, navigating, parallel parking, and practice road tests.

For your convenience all driving lessons will occur during school hours only. These comprehensive lessons will prepare the students for their driver license test.

### Why choose us?



The course fee is \$400 which is significantly lower than any competitor. Fee waiver applies to those who qualify.

Our instructors are Illinois State Board of Education Certified Driver Education Instructors with a Bachelor degree (120 credit hours) AND a Master degree (24 graduate hours) in Driver Education. Most instructors also hold other Master degrees as well such as leadership or Type 75 administration.

Our instructors are Illinois State Certified ADHD Trained Driving Instructors and are prepared to accommodate students with IEPs and 504 plans.

Our Instructors go to the DMV for you at the start of the semester to get the student's driving permit. Skip the line at the DMV!

With the Cooperative Driver Testing Program, if students qualify, they are able to take their road test with their instructor to obtain their driver's license. Skip the line at the DMV!

Students are placed into driving groups and have a definitive schedule so they can feel comfortable knowing when their next drive will be. Drives are scheduled throughout the course of the semester which gives students time to practice each lesson before moving on to the next one.

#### Q: Can I take DE as a freshman?

A: Yes! Since the law states you must have your permit for nine months before obtaining a license, freshmen can take DE.

### Q: When is the earliest I can get my permit?

A: 30 days prior to the first day of your session as long as you are 15 years old.
