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Glossary of Terms:

Backpack mail - Any school information or hand out that comes home via the students' backpacks.

Canvas- an on-line parent/student communication and information format that is used to house student work, to provide two-way communication between home and school and to highlight classroom sites.

CCSS- Common Core State Standards- upon which our District 203 curriculum is based.

Chew time – Students are asked not to talk for the last five minutes of the lunch period so that everyone has time to concentrate on eating their lunches rather than chatting.

CogAT - Cognitive Abilities Test, standardized test given to third, fourth and fifth graders.

ELL - English Language Learners. Our ELL program is intended for students whose native language is not English.

HM – Honors Math- Gifted math education for grades 3-5. Students must test into this program.

IEP- Individual Education Plan- An individual plan stating specific goal area for students eligible for special education services.

IOWA- lowa Tests of Basic Skills. Standardized tests given to third, fourth and fifth grade students.

LEAP - Kindergarten and first grade intervention program for students needing additional instruction in literacy.

LC - Learning Commons. This is where you'll find the school's Library, Maker Space and the location of information literacy instruction and small group support provided by parent volunteers in the areas of math and reading.

PARCC-Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers. This assessment is administered each spring in grades 3-5 and assess students' knowledge of common core objectives in the areas of math and reading. This is a computer based assessment.


PI – Project Idea. Academically talented students in fourth and fifth grades who meet the established District criteria are placed in Project Idea. This literacy program seeks to develop the higher-level thinking skills of analysis, synthesis, and evaluation.

PSA-Performance Series Assessment- This test is administered each fall, winter, and spring at grades 2-5 to provide evidence of student growth related to grade level standards in the areas of math and literacy.

Saddlefest - Fun-filled festival with games, food, raffles, and music held at Ranch View in the spring. Ranch View Home & School's primary fundraiser.

Full Day Schedule: 8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. Half Day Schedule: 8:15 a.m. – 11:35 a.m.

School buses begin their routes as early as 7:10 a.m. Please be at your stop 5-10 minutes early. You receive your bus assignment (time & place) thru *Infinite Campus* website, Transportation tab. The phone number for the Department of Transportation is 630-420-6464 if you have questions or concerns related to routes or bus stop locations.

Students in **third through fifth grade** may ride their bikes to school. However, once on school property the bike must be walked to the bike racks which are located at the southwest corner of the school. Bikes are to be locked in a vertical position. Younger students can ride to school if accompanied by a parent. Electric scooters or motorbikes are not allowed on school property. <u>Parents are always welcome to accompany their students as they walk to school, however pets are not allowed on school property when students are present.</u>

Dress Code

Any dress 'code' begins at home. The decision as to the style of clothes a child wears to school is primarily the parents' choice. However, graphics that depict violence or obscenities are not allowed. Please be sure your child is dressed for the weather of the day. Remember the building is air-conditioned and that student go outside for recess every day unless the wind chill is below zero. Snow pants, boots, mittens, hats, and coats are needed to play in snow. These items may not be left at school overnight or over weekends.

Telephone Rules

Students should not expect to make general use of the telephone. After-school activity arrangements should be made prior to arrival at school. Furthermore, the use of cell phones and any electronic communication devices by students is prohibited from the time students enter the building until the end of the last class period unless authorized or approved by the building administrator. Additionally, the use of electronic devices such as smartphones and tablets, by students, to take, display, or send images or text messages is prohibited on school grounds during the school day.

Visiting the School

Sign-In

All visitors must enter through Door 1. There you will find a log book that you need to sign. Provide your name, arrival time and the location within the school you will be visiting. Please bring in your driver's license so it may be scanned and a "Visitor Tag" may then be printed by the secretaries. While inside the building, your visitor tag must be worn and visible.

Sign Out

When you are done with your visit, return to the office window. Please enter your departure time in the log book. Exit the building through the main entrance, Door 1.

Carpool Riders


PLEASE NOTE: Drivers will remain on Ranch View Drive in the carpool lane marked by the diamonds and the white lines until 8:00 a.m. or 2:30 p.m. at which time they will be allowed to enter the school driveway.

For safety and efficiency, drivers must remain in their vehicles. If you have an unusual situation, a staff member will assist you.

Drivers must pull all the way forward in the carpool line where children should exit/enter the car along the sidewalk wherever the car stops. Students should not expect to be dropped off or picked up only at the front door.

All carpool students will enter and exit the building from the front door.

Go slow, be patient on Ranch View Drive. The actual amount of time you need to pick up or drop off is small in comparison to safety.



Traffic Patterns and Safety

It is important for our children to keep Ranch View School a safe place. Arrival and departure can be the most dangerous times of the day due to vehicular, pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Every effort is made to supervise and protect your child during these times. You can help ensure our students' safety by following the procedures outlined here.

Please adhere to the following guidelines each morning:

- Students will enter the building immediately upon arrival at 8:00AM and proceed to their classrooms. They will not be permitted to play on the school grounds.
- Students are not to arrive before 8:00. There is no supervision prior to 8:00, and students are not permitted to enter the building before 8:00. Special early morning programs are the exception.
- Attendance will be taken at 8:15AM. A child who enters the building after 8:15 must be signed in at the office by a parent or guardian. In the event of inclement weather slowing the arrival procedure, we will delay taking attendance.

General Bus Procedures (AM and PM):

- Our District 203 regular school buses will unload/load students in the driveway on the south side of the building along Auburn Avenue.
- Students riding the bus and/or daycare vans will enter and exit using the doors on the south side of the building (Doors 4 & 5).
- No vehicular traffic will be permitted in the bus lanes during school hours. (7:45 -3:00PM).

General Car Pool Procedures (AM and PM):

- Car pool students will enter and exit the school from the front door (Door #1).
- The parent drive at the front of the school will be used for both AM and PM drop-off and pick-up of students in private vehicles.
- Private vehicles may begin to line up in the Ranchview Drive at 2:20 PM. Please pull as far forward as possible. When the drive is full, cars form a single file line on Ranchview Drive.
- Cars can only enter the drive by approaching it from the north on Ranchview Drive. Cars that approach the driveway from the south are not permitted to make a left-hand turn into the circle.
- Drop-off and pick-up from private vehicles in the drive will take place in a single line only. Drivers should move as far forward in the drive as possible. Students may only exit vehicles from the curb side. Please remain in line until the cars in front of you move forward to exit. Do not pass stopped vehicles unless directed to do so by staff.
- Please drive slowly and remain patient both on Ranchview Drive and in the circle. The actual amount of time you need to drop-off or pick-up will made as brief as possible. We all must remember that the children's' safety is of the utmost priority.
- Signs provided by the City of Naperville indicate that the carpool circle regulations will be in effect both from 7:45-8:15AM and from 2:15-3:00PM.
- Parents and guardians will not be permitted to pick-up or drop-off children in our north parking lot (near the tennis courts). This lot is unsupervised and is not safe for student arrival and departure.

•	It is against state law to be on your cell phone in school speed zones. Fines begin at \$75.	

General Walking Procedures (AM and PM):

- Students who must cross Ranchview or Auburn Avenue should do so where crossing guards are stationed during arrival and dismissal.
- Walkers coming from the south side of Auburn Avenue who do not cross at Iona will continue to cross at Auburn and Ranchview under the Ranch View staff supervision. They will be directed to enter the building using the doors on the south side of the building (Doors #4).
- Students walking on the east side of Ranchview Drive will cross at the corner of Ranchview and Auburn and will enter the building using either Door #4.
- Door #3, Door #5, and Door #7 will no longer be used for student entry before school.
- At dismissal all walkers and bikers will exit the building through door# 6 which is at the back of the building facing the playground.
- Parents may arrange to meet their children on the playground blacktop at dismissal.
- Siblings of kindergarten walkers will be allowed to meet and exit through Door #1. No other walkers are permitted to exit through Door #1.
- Parents and guardians walking with children are not permitted to cut through the north parking lot (by the tennis courts) at any time. This lot is unsupervised and unsafe for student arrival and departure.

Absence Procedures

Reporting Absences

Please call the Health Office and use the following instructions:



- 1. Call 630-420-6576 by 8:15 a.m. to report daily absences.
- 2. A recording device will be used to record the following:
 - a. Date
 - b. Student's Name
 - c. Teacher's Name
 - d. Reason for Absence
- 3. If you anticipate the absence to be more than one day, call 630-420-6576 again between 10:00-2:00 and discuss the absence with the school health technician.

THIS PROCEDURE IS EFFECTIVE BEGINNING THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

Tardiness

Students are to be in their rooms and ready to begin instruction at 8:15 a.m. Punctuality is an important part of the child's development. Parents will be notified in case of excessive tardiness. If you are aware your child will be late in arriving at school, please call the absence line or send a note the previous day.

Arriving Late/Leaving Early

After class begins, all entrances are locked. If a student arrives late at school or leaves school other than at regular hours (8:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.), it is important that the student be signed in or out. Parents or guardians must report to the office to fill out the Student's Sign-In/Out log book (date, time, name, teacher, reason for absence, parent signature).

Learning Commons (LC)

Class Meets	Once a week for 50 minutes
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Class Activities

Mrs. Mougette meets with all students once per week on book checkout day.

Browsing Time - Students browse to locate books to check out.

Checkout - Once 2 books are chosen, students pick up their library card and check out the books. Students in grades 1-5 may also check out 1 magazine.

Returns - Books may be returned on any school day, not just on LC days. Books may be checked out for two weeks at a time, but can be returned earlier if desired.

Kindergartners are encouraged to return their books weekly, so they may check out new ones at each LC session.

Renewal - Students may renew books by bringing them to the checkout desk and asking that they be renewed.

Reminder Notices - Sent home, via email, when a book is overdue.

Payment for Lost or Damaged Books - Students are responsible to return books in good order. If the books are lost or badly damaged, they will be required to pay for the book.

Technology

Ranch View believes that technology needs to be integrated into the curriculum in a meaningful way. As a wireless school, students at Ranch View have access to technology throughout the entire building. This allows students and teachers to use technology whenever and wherever learning is occurring.

Curriculum/Technology Integration

Technology is used to enhance and enrich classroom curriculum. The district goals are as follows:

- 1) Use technology to find, retrieve and evaluate information
- 2) Use problem solving techniques and technology tools to collect, organize, and analyze information from a variety of sources
- 3) Use technology to communicate knowledge and ideas through media for various purposes and audiences
- 4) Use, manage, and adapt to changing technology in a learning environment, the workplace, and daily life
- 5) Use technology responsibly and demonstrate a recognition of and respect for the implications of its societal and environmental use

School Day Activities & Academic Support

Assemblies – Various assemblies are presented throughout the school year for *kindergarten to fifth* graders. Classroom teachers and Administrators choose the topics and presenters to reinforce the school's social and emotional and academic goals.

Band or Orchestra – At the end of 3rd grade, students/staff identify 1-2 instruments best suited for the child. Instruction is done in class and lesson schedules are rotated so as not to impact the same instructional period each week in *fourth and fifth* grades. Instruments may be rented or purchased. A summer session of instruction is offered to those interested in getting a jumpstart.

English Language Learners (ELL) – Support is provided for students whose native language is not English. Individual student need determines the intensity of ELL instruction.

Honors Math – Third through fifth grade students meeting specific criteria will be placed into Honors Math.

Lunch – All students have a 20-minute lunch period and a 20-minute recess period. Children can bring sack lunches to school or order hot lunch provided by Aramark Food Services. Menus are sent home each month and payment can be made in cash, check or online using the Aramark link on the district and Ranch View websites. **Checks should be made payable to: NCUSD203 Include your child's student ID#**

Project Idea (PI) – Academically talented students in the *fourth and fifth* grades meeting the established District criteria will be placed in Project Idea. This literacy program seeks to develop the high-level thinking skills of analysis, synthesis, and evaluation.

Reading Support – This program provides children in *kindergarten through fifth* grade support in developing their literacy skills. Students in this program are selected through reading screening and teacher referral.

Safety Patrol – Under the Safety Director's supervision, *fifth* grade students volunteer to assist with student safety before and after school as students arrive and leave the school.

School Store – As a benefit to all students and parents, our Home and School operates a school store one day each week. Students may purchase school supplies on Tuesdays from 8:00 – 8:20 a.m.

Service Projects – To develop the spirit of caring for others and giving back to the community, the students plan and implement service project(s) during the school year. Examples of past service projects include selling bookmarks created by the students to sponsor a dog for pet-assisted therapy, collecting toiletries for a shelter, and writing letters to soldiers stationed over-seas.

Special Education – Specialists provide a wide range of services to students who need support beyond the regular classroom. These include a learning behavioral specialist, an occupational therapist, a speech teacher, a social worker, and a psychologist.

STEM – An after-school opportunity for students in *fourth and fifth grades* to compete in the Illinois State First Lego League Competition and explore a variety of other technology based activities within a Maker's Space environment that includes coding, programming, use of our 3D printer, robotics and a variety of applications that support innovation and creativity.

Student Council – Two students from each classroom in *first through fifth* grade are elected by their classmates to participate in Student Council for the school year. Student council meets approximately twice a month and plans special events and service projects, and prepares school-wide announcements. The principal consults with representatives on special projects.

Signupgenius.com- an online sign-up system utilizing email to provide information to families regarding volunteer opportunities within the school.

After-School Activities

In most cases, registration information for after-school activities will be sent home at the beginning of the year. Below is a list of typical programs.

School Sponsored

Chess Club

All interested students in grades one through five may join the chess club. Experience groups students to learn to play and to improve their game. The club meets about once per month in the LC. There is an opportunity for students to play competitively in a tournament each spring.

Chorus

Both boys and girls in the fifth grade may participate in the vocal ensemble which rehearses approximately once per week before school. The chorus performs 2-3 times each semester, at Ranch View and throughout the community. Students will experience singing, movement, and playing recorders and Orff instruments in chorus. Students are asked to wear a white shirt and black pants for performances.

Reading Rangers

Students in fourth and fifth grade join this lunch-hour book club. Students read from the Battle of the Books list which can be found on the school's website.

Running Club (held before school)

Students may participate in the Fall and/or Spring Running Club. Runners can expect sprinting, jogging, interval training, stretching, goal-setting, competing, core strengthening, and speeding around obstacle courses!!!! The goal is for each student to become a better runner and lead an active life! No running experience is necessary.

Communication

Information from your child's teachers, principal and school district will come to you either via backpack mail (mail brought home by your child in their take-home folder) or through online communications (email or websites).

Important Communication Resources

Monthly Calendar of Events – Accessed on the Ranch View website, an online view of all the events and activities going on at Ranch View during the month selected.

Parent/Student Handbook – Distributed by the school once a year in fall. Contains policies and information regarding District 203, Ranch View School, and Ranch View Home & School Association.

Directory – Distributed in the early fall by Ranch View's Home & School Association. The directory contains family contact information, staff listing, class lists, Home & School committees and coordinators and the price list for the school store. The information in the directory is not to be used for solicitation or business purposes and inclusion is optional.

Student Progress Reports – Report cards uploaded to students Infinite Campus three times during the school year (November, March and on the last day of school). Both parents are encouraged to attend Parent Conferences held two times per year during October and February.

Ranch View Review – Ranch View's digital newsletter, The Ranch View Review, is produced 3 times a year by the Home & School Association. It includes a letter from the principal, updates from each grade level and highlights of upcoming events. Available on the RV website.

Weekly / Monthly Classroom Newsletter – Classroom teachers send home an update for the week / month telling parents specifically what is scheduled for the curriculum that period and highlights from the previous period. Teachers also use the newsletter to make general announcements and reminders for parents of upcoming events. Some teachers send this newsletter via email if possible or utilize Canvas, a student information system to relay assignments, classroom events, blogging opportunities etc.

What is the Campus Portal?

Campus Portal is a means to further promote educational excellence by enhancing our program of communication with parents and students.

Who is eligible to have a Campus Portal account?

Parents of current students are eligible to activate a Parent Portal account, after agreeing to the terms and conditions of use.

Computer – any computer capable of running the browser Internet Explorer 5.0 or higher, Macintosh or Windows. Software – Internet Explorer 5.0 or higher. It is a free download from www.microsoft.com Internet connection – 56k modem speed or higher is recommended. A monitor with at least 800x600 resolution is recommended.

Canvas

What is the Canvas?

Canvas is an information management site utilized by staff and students to relay information. Teachers set up Canvas class sites to relay information regarding curriculum, class events, student assignments etc. Parents and students have the capability to join discussion boards/blogs to respond to teacher questions, assignments, or peer submissions.

Who is eligible to have a Canvas access?

All students and parents will have access to Canvas. Parents will be invited to a class canvas site and will have the opportunity to sign up for Canvas access during Curriculum Nights held in the fall.

What kind of software or computer is needed to access Canvas?

Computer – any computer capable of running the browser Internet Explorer 5.0 or higher, Macintosh or Windows. Software – Internet Explorer 5.0 or higher. It is a free download from www.microsoft.com. Internet connection – 56k modem speed or higher is recommended. A monitor with at least 800x600 resolution is recommended.

How much does Canvas cost?

Nothing. It is a free service to parents, and saves the district money by reducing paperwork and labor costs.

Annual Home & School Events

Refer to the Ranch View Monthly Calendar for specific dates and times.

JULY-AUGUST

- Summer packets are mailed with all pertinent information and forms regarding the upcoming school year.
- A **new family welcome** is held every year. Parents of students in 1st-5th grade will have the opportunity to tour the school and ask questions about their new school community.
- The **school store** is open at designated times the week school begins. Look for the specifics to be included in your summer packet. During the year the school store is available to students each Tuesday morning from 8:00-8:30.
- **Kindergarten "Sneak Peek**" is held during the first day of attendance for upper grade students. This day is specific to your kindergartner's special time to meet the teacher and tour the classroom to get familiar with the surroundings. Kindergarten students officially begin their first day of attendance on the second day of school.
- Curriculum Night held between late August/early September. This evening is intended to give parents the
 opportunity to meet their child's teacher and get a preview of the curriculum for their specific grade level.
 Please arrange for daycare on this evening so you can focus on your child's new teacher and educational
 program.
- **School Picture Day** will take place in August. These pictures are included in our Ranch View Yearbook as well as in the class pictures. Information regarding specific costs and exact date will be sent home.
- **Gift Wrapping Fundraiser** shop via catalog and stock up on gift wrap and accessories for everyday and seasonal gift giving.
- Fifth graders, accompanied by their teachers, participate in **Outdoor Education**, a trip held over two days in the fall. The students learn about the outdoor environment related to the curriculum and use skills in problem solving, teamwork and cooperation. The cost of this program is funded in part by Home and School.
- Our annual Ice Cream Social to kick off the school year is held in late August. Students and their families are
 invited to enjoy a sundae from Dairy Queen, created by your favorite teachers. The Ranch View community has
 been known to put away over 1400 sundaes at this event!

SEPTEMBER

- Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) assessment for third grade takes place during mid-September.
- Performance Series Testing- assessment for grades 1-5 aligned to common core standards in math and reading

OCTOBER

- Vision and Hearing Screenings are done in fall. Grades K, 1st, 2nd and 3rd are given hearing tests while 2nd grade is tested on vision. The district provides this service.
- The annual sale of Ranch View **Spirit Wear** begins in October. Students and staff can be seen sporting t-shirts and sweatshirts showing their school spirit!
- Support RVHS and get a jump start on your holiday shopping with Art to Remember fundraiser. Your child's artwork is placed on personalized products.
- Our fall Book Fair is held in early October. A large selection of books and novelty items are available for purchase. The Book Fair coincides with the week of Parent/Teacher Conferences. An additional book fair is held in the spring and coincides with spring parent/teacher conferences.
- The first of two scheduled **Parent/Teacher Conferences** are held in early October. All parents are provided the opportunity to meet with your child's teacher for specific progress reports on your child. This meeting is held as a checkpoint midway through the first trimester.
- Our annual Autumn on Parade takes place on October 31st. This event allows the children to dress-up in costumes to celebrate the annual fall holidays. The children parade outdoors on the blacktop (weather permitting) or the gym to an audience of parents and siblings at 1:00pm. *NOTE: All parents are invited for the 20-30-minute parade of costumes.
- Immediately following Autumn on Parade, a **Fall Party** is held in each classroom. The party begins at 1:30 and lasts until approximately 2:15. Parents can volunteer to plan the party or to help on that day by signing up as a party helper through the head room parents/Home and School organization.

NOVEMBER

- Students participate in a brief **Veteran's Day Ceremony** in November.
- First trimester report cards are available online at the end of the first trimester in early November.
- The Fall Band / Orchestra Concert is held in November. Everyone is invited to attend.

DECEMBER

- Ranch View's district renowned **all-school winter program** in December. Two performances are given, one at am and one at pm. (You will be notified in which one your child will participate.) Our music teacher works with the children starting in early October to create a show allowing all the children to participate in a celebration of the winter season.
- Winter Parties are celebrated in each classroom on the last day of school prior to Winter Break. Parents can volunteer to plan the party by signing up as a party helper through the head room parents/Home and School parent organization.

JANUARY

- In late January your child will guide you to all the teachers, activities, and places he/she enjoys at Ranch View during **Open House Night**. Student school work will be on display for you to view and enjoy. The entire family is invited to this event.

- Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held in February. The second report card is issued at this time.
- Our Spring Book Fair is held during parent teacher conferences, offering a large assortment of books available for purchase.

MARCH

- The Spring Band / Orchestra / Chorus Concert is held in March. Everyone is invited to attend.
- **Kindergarten Preview** is held each spring. All incoming kindergartners and their parents are invited to find out what Ranch View is like. The children spend an hour in a kindergarten classroom, while parents learn all pertinent information about what to expect during this first school experience. There is NO SCHOOL for our attending kindergarten students that day.
- **SADDLEFEST,** our annual Fun Fair and Raffle/Auction, is held in the spring. There are games for the children, lots of food, a bake sale, and a raffle/silent auction. This is accomplished with the help of 200 volunteers from the Ranch View community. The whole family is encouraged to attend!

APRIL

- PARCC- assessment- for grades 3-5 aligned to common core standards for literacy and math
- Third graders and staff identify one or two instruments best suited for the student during the Band and
 Orchestra Instrument Selection process.
- Ranch View sponsors a team of students in fourth and fifth grades in **Battle of the Books**, a district competition where teams answer questions about selected books.

<u>MAY</u>

• Performance Series Testing- assessment for grades 1-5 aligned to common core standards in math and reading

- Ranch View sponsors a **Spring Flower Sale.** An amazing variety of annuals are available for purchase, as well as hanging baskets, planters, etc. Delivery of the flowers is in early May.
- Students remember their teachers with homemade cards and flowers while Home and School arranges food during **Teacher Appreciation Week.**
- Volunteer Breakfast- a breakfast hosted by Ranch View staff to thank all parent volunteers
- **Field Day and Picnic** is held late in the month in celebration of the end of the school year. All children participate during one of the last days of school.
- The annual **Awards Assembly** is held the day before school is out for the year. Attendance and special awards are given out on this day. Attendance is student only.
- Classes end in late May assuming no emergency days are needed.
