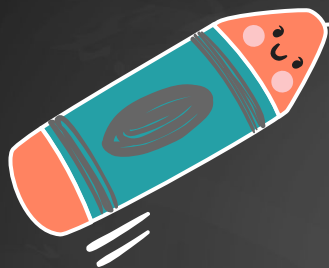


## Daily Attendance
