

What do you think are some important qualities



Pumpkin Cake

Ingredients:

Cake:

*1 pie pumpkin

3 tablespoons of pumpkin pie spice

1 tablespoon of baking powder

2 tablespoons of cinnamon

4 cups of flour

½ a tsp of baking soda

½ a cup of olive oil

1/4 cup of brown sugar

3 tbsp of milk

1 ½ cups of granulated sugar

½ cup of butter

Frosting:

24 oz. of cream cheese2 sticks of unsalted butter3 tablespoons of heavy cream

½ cup of powdered sugar

*1 pie pumpkin - Optional but adds a better flavor than if substituted with canned pumpkin.

Other Information:

Yield: 8 layers (15 servings)

Time: 1 hours 45 mins Prep Time: 1 hour

Cook Time: 45 mins

A: My favorite part of participating in the musical was all of the new friends I made and the opportunity I was given to be the best Fiona that I could be. I loved working with the directors, Mr. Colbert and Mrs. Ceresa, and I looked forward to practicing every single day.

I've been into musical theater for my whole life and I was thrilled that the school was giving students the opportunity to do what they love. I did the school musical all three years of junior high, but in 6th grade we were unable to perform due to Covid restrictions and seventh grade was an online play. This was my first real experience in a school production and I'm so glad I did it.

A: I was first confused as to why the musical chosen was Shrek, because I had only known it as the funny few movies about an ogre. Although the decision was confusing to me, I decided to do it anyway, as it was the first, and last time I would ever have the opportunity to perform at Madison. My reaction quickly changed after realizing what the musical was about, and I was very excited to start practicing.

Q: Would you want to participate in the musical again in the future?

A: I will be performing in musicals in the future at Naperville Central, and I am very excited to do so. As I had said before, musicals have always been a big part of my life, and I would like to continue that as I get older.

Q: What is something that you feel that you or everyone else could have done better on?

A: I think that everyone who participated in the musical did an amazing job. There are very few things that I can critique about the performances,

Instructions:

Preparation:

Preheat the oven to 250 degrees Fahrenheit. Butter 8, ¼ inch baking pans and line with parchment paper.

Preparation for the Pumpkin:

Take your pumpkin, wash it, and carve out the top. Next, scoop out the guts and seeds. Cut the hollowed out pumpkin into 3 inch wedges. Butter a 18x9 inch baking sheet and place your pumpkin wedges (with the skin on) onto your sheet. Bake in the oven for 15 minutes.

Make the Batter:

Once the pumpkin has come out of the oven, let it cool for 10 minutes before peeling off the skin. Take the wedges and place them in a *food processor with olive oil, brown sugar, milk, softened butter, and granulated sugar. Pulse for 4 minutes. Once the mixture is a purée, place it in a glass bowl. Add in flour, baking powder, pumpkin pie spice, and baking soda.

Bake:

Place the batter evenly throughout the pans and place in the oven at 250 degrees for 20 minutes with four pans in the oven at a time (If your oven has one shelf then you can bake them in two pan intervals). Once all of the cakes are done baking and cooling for 10 minutes each, place parchment paper on a plate and stack all the layers up with parchment paper in between each one.

Make the frosting:

In a *large bowl or the bowl of a stand mixer, cream together cream cheese and butter until mixed evenly. Next, add in powdered sugar in two parts before adding in the heavy cream (unwhipped).

Frost the Cake:

Feel the cakes to make sure they cooled down. Take a piping bag with a piping tip filled with your cream cheese frosting. Pipe rough circles in between each cake layer before flattening the icing with an offset spatula. Once all the cakes are evenly stacked, ice the sides *roughly and top with another coat of frosting using the same technique as the filling. Afterwards, you can decorate your cake with anything from sprinkles, fondant, or other *edible decorations. Enjoy!

*Instead of a food processor, you could use a blender although the processor will give a better purée
*If using a glass bowl, you can whip the frosting with a hand mixer although the stand mixer does a better job!
*This rough ice is called the crumb coat because it locks in the cake crumbs for a neater finished product!
*Silicone molds can be filled with melted chocolate chips for fancy-looking decorations

The last thing I want to say is a thank you to everyone who worked so hard on the show. Shrek was an amazing opportunity and experience and I had such a fun time working with everyone to put on the best production we could perform.

Slice Factory

Slice Factory is located at 227 S Weber Rd, Bolingbrook, IL, it also has many other locations in the Chicagoland area, as found on their website. It may not be a well known place but it is definitely worth checking out. It's new to the area and was only opened 6 months ago. The menu has a very big variety and so much to choose from. There is a section for.. Starters, Burgers, Different sandwiches, and a ton of different dinners, not just pizza. Some menu items are, Burgers, fries, pizza, onion rings, mozzarella sticks and even more. My personal favorite is the mozzarella sticks.

The restaurant has a drive through which is much busier than the inside counter. It was very clean and had good maintenance, the decorations were nice as well, they had nice decor everywhere in the signature colors of grey, black and yellow. Also, they had different quotes and sayings to represent the restaurant on the walls.

There were only 4 or 5 people working the whole restaurant and they seemed very busy. The staff was nice but had different levels of knowledge. Some are new with less experience while others are more familiar with the menu and items to order. The two staff we ordered from were both very kind and got us our food without a fight. The service was good but it did take a little longer than other fast food restaurants, like 10 minutes, for us to actually receive the food, but that just could've been our large order.

The menu was quite large, with many different options, it was hard to decide what to get and we kept on changing our order just because of how much food we wanted to try. The staff was patient with us and gave us suggestions. The main attraction to Slice Factory is the pizza, the whole pizza is 28 inches across! Just one slide is 14 inches and can feed two people. We ordered a variety of items including the appetizer sampler which included mozzarella sticks, onion rings, fried ravioli and wings with three kinds of dipping sauces. We also got cheese pizza, and chicken tenders tossed in garlic parmesan. Finally, we got a couple of their most popular desserts which are the nutella bites and a cream cheese icing filled red velvet doughnut.

The food comes in a decent portion for the price. For example, the appetizer sampler platter and the seven piece chicken tenders could easily be shared by 4 to 6 people. You definitely get what you pay for! The food we tried was pretty average and they gave more fries than they did anything else in the sampler platter. The best items in our order were the chicken tenders and the desserts. The pizza was good but a bit chewier than I prefer.

I tried Slice Factory with my cousin Maya Khan and my mom. Maya says, "The restaurant has its perks, but it needs a little work on the food and the service." and my mom says"It's fun What is red and smells like blue paint?
