Community

Naperville is a suburban community of over 144,000 residents. It is located thirty miles west of Chicago on I-88, the high-tech corridor of the western suburbs. The majority of residents are engaged in business, professional, managerial, and technical occupations.

School

Naperville Central High School is a public, four-year comprehensive high school with 238 certified staff members, a majority of whom have a Master's degree or beyond. The school day consists of eight 50-minute periods. All classes meet five days per week, during two 18-week semesters. Naperville Central's 2019-2020 enrollment is 2,683 including 658 freshmen, 669 sophomores, 638 juniors, and 686 seniors and 32 transition students.
