Community

Naperville is a suburban community of over 144,000 residents. It is located thirty miles west of Chicago on I-88, the high-tech corridor of the western suburbs. The majority of residents are engaged in business, professional, managerial, and technical occupations.

School

Naperville Central High School is a public, four-year comprehensive high school with 239 certified staff members, a majority of whom have a Master's degree or beyond. The school day consists of eight 50-minute periods. All classes meet five days per week, during two 18-week semesters. Naperville Central's 2021-2022 enrollment is 2,578 including 624 freshmen, 602 sophomores, 658 juniors, and 655 seniors and 39 transition students.
