## Community

Naperville is a suburban community of over 144,000 residents. It is located thirty miles west of Chicago on I-88, the high-tech corridor of the western suburbs. The majority of residents are engaged in business, professional, managerial, and technical occupations.

## School

Naperville Central High School is a public, four-year comprehensive high school with 236 certified staff members, a majority of whom have a Master's degree or beyond. The school day consists of eight 50-minute periods. All classes meet five days per week during two 18-week semesters. Naperville Central's 2018-19 enrollment is 2,726 including 674 freshmen, 643 sophomores, 697 juniors, 673 seniors and 39 transition students.

Naperville Central High School is accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education and is a member of: the Illinois Association for College Admission Counseling, the National Association for College Admission Counseling, and the National College Board. Naperville Central has been named one of America's Top High Schools by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. It's also ranked as one of the best high schools in the state of Illinois by *U.S. News & World Report*, *School Digger* and *Niche.com*.
