Welcome to Kennedy Junior High. The information below is to give families a broad overview of our school and to address frequently asked questions.

### What is a Middle School?

Kennedy uses a middle school model for organization even though 'junior high' is in our official name. A middle school model allows for placing students on grade level teams with common Math, English Language Arts (ELA), Science and Social Science teachers. Such organization allows for coordination of supports and targeted opportunities for social-emotional learning.

- 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> period are designated as lunch periods.
- Four minute passing periods take place between each class.

### **Transportation**

- The majority of our students are bused, as we have attendees from all elementary schools due to the three specialized programs we host. Most buses drop off students between 7:25-7:40 a.m. and pick up between 3:00-3:15 p.m.
- Bike racks are available at the front of the building.
- Drop offs or pick-ups of students take place in front of the building in the specified lane. We do experience heavy traffic regularly from 7:45-8:00 a.m. and from 2:40-3:10 p.m.

- English Language Arts (ELA) is taught as a block of two, forty minute periods.
- Physical Education occurs daily.
- All 6th grade students are assigned the same lunch period.
- Exploratory classes occur in a rotation throughout the year in which students have a quarter each of Art, Family and Consumer Science (FACS), General M4usic, and Project Lead the Way (PLTW).
- For supervised study, students are assigned to a classroom and teacher from their team. This
  period is used for homework completion, seeking extra help from a teacher, <u>targeted</u>
  <u>intervention support</u>, make-up work, etc.
- Performance music large groups rehearse 1-2 days per week during supervised study.

# **Physical Education**

- Students wear a designated uniform and are provided ample time to change at the beginning and end of the period. In addition to a hall locker, students will be assigned a PE locker.
- 12 activity rotations take place over 30 weeks of the school year.
- Students use the Fitness Center at least one day per week.
- All students also have one six-week rotation of health taught in the classroom.

# Performance Music

- Large group rehearsal occurs during supervised study two days per week. Students meet for sectional lessons through pull out time during the school day; their sectional meeting rotates so that they do not miss the same academic course more than once per month.
- Concerts take place three times per year.

## **Extra-Curricular Activities**

• Though students cannot participate in intra-scholastic athletics until 7<sup>th</sup> grade, there are a wide variety of sports and activities offered before and after school in intramurals and clubs.
