The Jefferson Music Staff is pleased that you and your child have chosen to be in Performance Music. We are very proud of our Band, Orchestra, and Choir programs and believe that your child will have an extremely rewarding experience this school year.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR MEMBERSHIP IN JJHS PERFORMANCE MUSIC ORGANIZATIONS

- Choir, Band and Orchestra are full year classes. Students are expected to remain enrolled for the full school year.
- Students and/or parents should address all questions regarding membership or attendance to their respective director.

INSTRUMENT SECURITY

- Jefferson Junior High School provides a storage area for musical instruments. Band and Orchestra members can be issued a JJHS Band/Orchestra lock. While locks are not required, we recommend students having one to ensure their instrument; books, etc. do not get misplaced or mixed up with those of other students. **Personal locks are not allowed.**
- While we do supply locks and lockers, the school is not responsible for damaged, lost or stolen instruments. Model, make and serial number of your child's instrument should be registered at home.

PERFORMANCES

Students are required to attend the concerts of their respective ensembles. The annual Solo/Ensemble Festival for Band and Orchestra members is also a required performance. A student is excused from a performance if he/she is ill and is absent from school or is out of town with his/her family. The director must be notified of the absence <u>WELL</u> in advance. Other absences are unexcused. FAMILY PARTIES, SOCIAL EVENTS AND ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES would not be considered an excused absence. An unexcused absence will result in a lower grade.

Please note:

• Students must be in attendance for at least five periods on the day of a musical performance event.

• Students who are absent from school for more than 4 periods on the day of a concert may not participate in the evening performance.

BAND

- 8th Grade Wind Ensemble: rehearses three times per week
- 7th Grade Symphonic Band: rehearses three times per week.
- 6th Grade Concert Band: rehearses twice per week.
- All band members have 1 small group lesson per week. <u>Extra-Curricular Ensembles</u>
- Jazz Band: (Wednesday mornings before school) Open to all 6th, 7th and 8th grade band members. No audition is required.
- Jazz Ensemble: (Monday mornings before school) Open to all 7th and 8th grade band members by audition.

ORCHESTRA

- Orchestra: Open to all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade string players. Each week, string players attend one small group lesson and two full orchestra rehearsals (beginners join full orchestra during the 3th trimester).
- **Symphonic Orchestra:** Open to selected 8th grade Wind Ensemble players. Symphonic Orchestra gives students the opportunity to play full orchestra literature with soloistic wind and percussion parts. Meets during the 2th trimester during supervised study and performs at the March orchestra concert.

Extra-Curricular Ensemble

String Fusion: (Thursday mornings before school) Open to all Orchestra members. No audition is required for membership.

<u>CHOIR</u>

Jefferson has three choirs that are open to all students.

• **Choirs** rehearse two or three times per week. Your schedule will be given to you after the first day of choir

Extra-Curricular Ensemble

• Jefferson Singers: (Tuesday mornings at 7:00 AM) Open to all 7th and 8th grade choir members by audition. You must be registered in curricular choir to audition.

CONCERT UNIFORM FOR ALL PERFORMING GROUPS

The concert uniform consists of a music department polo shirt, black pants, black shoes and socks. Flip-flops are not allowed for music performances. The music department shirt can be purchased through the school. Order forms will be provided.

Important Information for Choir Members

CHOIR REHEARSALS

Choir students' weekly schedule will be handed out after the first day of choir.

Please note:

- Choir students may have the option of coming to the band room for a homework/lunch period on rehearsal days.
- Choir members do not necessarily lose study hall/homework time on the days they have Choir.

Attendance

- All Choir members are expected to be at their designated choir rehearsals/sectionals and choir concerts.
- **Concerts are considered trimester assessments.** An unexcused absence from a concert will result in a student's choir grade being <u>lowered by two letters</u>.
- Choir members should always bring in a note from home to explain an absence from a concert.

CHOIR EXPECTATIONS

All Choir students are expected to be active, engaged learners at rehearsals and concerts. Concerts are considered trimester assessments, and are mandatory.

The Choir letter grade is based on vocal work done at weekly rehearsals, concert performances, and various in-class assignments. The Jefferson choral department puts much emphasis on *EFFORT and a POSITIVE ATTITUDE!*
