Health Office Reminders

HEALTH OFFICE REMINDERS

The Naper Elementary Health Office greatly appreciates everyone's efforts during this pandemic. It is through our joint efforts that we can help maintain a healthy in-person learning environment for students, staff and all of our Naper families!

COVID-19 Positive Test

If anyone in your family tests positive for COVID-19 please notify the Naper health office, regardless of your student's vaccination status. The health office will contact you to determine the next steps needed to be compliant with District 203 COVID-19 protocol.

Below are highlights to the changes in the COVID-19 protocol brought to D203 this week:

- Students who test positive for COVID-19 will only need to isolate for 5 days from their symptom onset or positive test date if asymptomatic.
 - o Symptom onset or positive test date is considered day 0.
- Students who are an unvaccinated close contact to an individual who tests positive for COVID-19 will only need to quarantine for 5 days from their last contact with the positive individual.
 - o The last day of contact with the positive individual is considered day 0.
 - o As a reminder, only school close contacts can participate in the Test To Stay program.
- Students who are symptomatic and do not obtain a COVID-19 diagnostic test will only need to quarantine for 5 days from their symptom onset.
 - o Symptom onset date is considered day 0.
- Unvaccinated students who travel internationally will only need to quarantine for 5 days
 - o The day of return is considered day 0.
 - o A COVID test must be completed between days 3-5 of return and a negative test result must be received before the student is able to return to in-person learning on day 6.

Important COVID-19 reminders:

- Please keep your student home if they are showing signs of illness and notify attendance or the health office.
- Symptomatic students must obtain a diagnostic test from a lab / health care provider. A negative at-home test result is not currently accepted by D203.
- If your student is showing symptoms of COVID-19, please schedule a diagnostic COVID-19 test. The health office must have confirmation that a test is scheduled within 24 hours in order for all unvaccinated siblings to continue to attend in-person learning. We don't need the results, just that a test result is pending.
- We encourage you to upload your students' vaccination status if you haven't, as this will help our contact tracers as well as the health office staff. Students who are identified as a close contact from a positive individual will not be excluded from school if asymptomatic and we

COVID-19 Reminder

Students who are **fully vaccinated** and are identified as a close contact to a person who tests positive for COVID-19 will not be required to self-isolate if they are asymptomatic. Fully vaccinated means that the student is at least 2 weeks out from their second COVID-19 vaccination. Please consider sending a copy of your students COVID-19 vaccination card to the health office so this information is readily available if needed.

For those students identified as a close contact to a person who tests positive for COVID-19 **in the school setting** who are not vaccinated, or partially vaccinated, now have the option to participate in the Test To Stay program. Through serial testing offered through D203 at PSAC, students will be able to return to in-person learning after their first negative saliva test and continue to attend in-person learning as long as they continue to test as outlined in the Test To Stay program. *This program only applies to students exposed to COVID-19 in the school setting.*

International Travel Guideline:

If your family plans to travel internationally, please notify the Naper health office prior to your departure, so the health office staff may review with you the current guidelines. As of 12/13/2021 District 203 protocol for return to in-person learning after international travel is:

Fully vaccinated students

- Get tested three to five days after travel. **Day of return is day zero.**
- Self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days after return; isolate and test if symptoms develop
- **Fully vaccinated students can return to school immediately.**

Unvaccinated students:

- Get tested three to five days after travel. **Day of return is day zero.**
- Self-quarantine for a full **seven** days after travel, even with a negative test result.
- Unvaccinated students can return on day **eight** if a negative test is provided to the health office
- If your test is positive, isolate and inform your school's health office
- If you choose not to test: self-quarantine for ten days,, students may return on day 11
