National Board Certified Teacher

Superintendent Bridges congratulated Lori Peterson, F.A.C.S. teacher at Madison Junior High School for earning National Board Certification. National Board Certification, by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, is one of the most prestigious credentials a teacher can earn. Those who achieve the status of National Board Certified Teacher have met rigorous standards through intensive study, expert evaluation, self-assessment and peer review. To date, about 75 teachers, who are currently employed by District 203, have earned National Board Certification; they join 82,000 teachers throughout the country who have achieved this mark of excellence. The leaders of the cohort for mentoring are: Ann Schinske, Lynn Henz, David Carroll and Cathy Kaduk.

Superintendent Bridges noted that one of his privileges as superintendent is visiting schools and seeing students at work. Recently he visited Steeple Run Elementary school and was able to see how the District Mission Statement drives everything we do. He noted the collaboration that is taking place between the 2nd graders and 5th graders to be community contributors on a global level in creating books to be sent to Uganda. He thanked Dr. Paula Helberg, Reading Specialist, Meredith Mitchel, 5th grade teacher, and Jennifer Reible, 2nd grade teacher for their innovative project.

Superintendent Staff/School Reports

Art Innovation Project

Superintendent Bridges noted that through the innovation process, teachers Kyle Wood, art teacher at Highlands and Chuck Hoff, art teacher at Mill Street piloted the use of an ebook compiled for students to self-direct collaboration interpreting lessons between the fifth grade classrooms at the different schools.

Superintendent Bridges noted that a video created by the students resulting from the innovation process is a finalist in the first ever White House Student Film Festival. A team of students, Mr. Wood and Mr. Hoff will be traveling to Washington D.C. for the festival in late February.

Mr. Wood and Mr. Hoff gave an overview of how the innovation process has worked in their classrooms. Teachers draw from each other's strengths since teachers are stronger in different areas. A project was introduced live in one classroom and by video to the other classroom for the first 10 minutes of the class time. The video was shut off and both classes went about completing the project. The interpretations were completely different. The students then assessed each-other's work and shared each other's perspectives by live video.

The video that was created by the students for the Film Festival was played and it was noted that the students collaborated by sending video clips back and forth between the schools to demonstrate each other's work with the goal of completing the film.

Mr. Wood and Mr. Hoff noted that next steps would be to acquire more Ipads and other technology for the classrooms. They are comfortable with crossing over to other areas of study like reading. They thanked the Board noting that the innovation process has been a tremendous experience for both the teachers and students and has opened the doors for endless future possibilities.

Mr. Brunelle explained that the innovation process came about as an opportunity to inspire the creativity among teachers and bring their ideas forward. Money was built into the budget to fund proposals that are written by teachers. The proposals are reviewed by the appropriate staff and brought to cabinet for approval to fund and to pilot in the schools.

Review Updated Five Year Financial Report from Citizens' Finance Advisory Committee

Brad Cauffman indicated that on Feb 16, 2014 the Citizens' Finance Advisory Committee met. The committee is comprised of participants from all backgrounds who provide valuable information and input. They worked on establishing assumptions to develop a base model for the budget going forward. Mr. Cauffman reviewed the assumptions currently in place, recommendations for some changes and how the changes will impact the model. He will rebuild the new model based on Board members' feedback and present it to the Citizen's Finance Advisory Committee at their next meeting on February 26. Once the base model is in place, variable factors will be added in. The Board

will discuss this at future meetings.

Crotty seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Jaensch, Price, Crotty, Wandke, Fielden Fitzgerald, and Romberg. No: none. The motion carried.

3. Possible Action to Approve Severance Agreement and General Release Romberg made a motion to approve the Severance Agreement and General Release for Dan Velisek as amended in Closed Session. Crotty seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Crotty, Fitzgerald, Fielden, Price, Jaensch, Wandke, and Romberg. No: None. The motion carried.

Discussion Without Action

Debt Service Tax Levv

Brad Cauffman explained that this is the first of three meetings that the Debt Service Tax Levy will be discussed, with action on the third meeting, March 17, 2014. The purpose tonight is to give an overview of the timeline and to review some background information. The Board of Education issued bonds, as authorized by the 2008 referendum. The bonds are repaid by an annual tax levy that was adopted at the time the bonds were issued. The tax will be levied unless the Board passes a resolution to abate the tax. The District has abated the tax four of the last five years. Mr. Cauffman will amend the base model as previously discussed and bring feedback from the Citizens Finance Advisory Committee to the March 3 Board meeting for discussion. The Board requested some information on alternate abatement models, like partial abatement, postponed abatement or bi-annual abatement for discussion at the next meeting.

First Reading: Online/Blended Consortium IGA Phase II

Jennifer Hester noted that the Board previously agreed to move forward to Phase 2 of the Online/Blended Consortium. The one significant change is that there are only three districts in the consortium now. The IGA to continue work with Evergreen Group has been approved by the District legal counsel. The name of the consortium is now ELO – Expanding Learning Opportunities. We had good face to face meetings and are on time with the timeline. The increase in cost to the District with only 3 schools remaining is \$10,000. The Board will be asked to take action on March 3, 2014.

Discussion With Action

Superintendent Bridges noted that the only change in the fees is an increase in the Early Childhood fee.

Draft 2015 - 2016 Calendar

Kaine Osburn reported that the feedback he has received on the proposed calendar has been positive for the most part.

Price made a motion to approve the Draft 2015 – 2016 Calendar as presented. Jaensch seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Romberg, Jaensch, Fitzgerald, Crotty, Wandke, Price and Fielden. No: None. The motion carried.

Resolution determining to proceed with the solicitation of bids for the purchase and cancellation of certain of the General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2008, of Naperville Community Unit School District Number 203, DuPage and Will Counties, Illinois

Brad Cauffman noted that this is a good opportunity to solicit bids to repurchase the 2008 bonds and save the taxpayers a lot of money. Fielden made a motion to approve the Resolution determining to proceed with

the solicitation of bids for the purchase and cancellation of certain of the General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2008, of Naperville Community Unit School District Number 203, DuPage and Will Counties, Illinois. Wandke seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Fitzgerald, Wandke, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

Second Reading: Policy 1.10, School District Legal Status

Price made a motion to approve Policy 1.10, School District Legal Status as presented. Crotty seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Romberg, Fielden, Wandke, Price, Crotty, Jaensch, and Fitzgerald. No: None. The motion carried.

is to identify the Beliefs, Vision and Mission exclusively in the policy. Mrs.
Ryan reviewed some significant connections and carry overs between the work
of the District now and what Standard Bearer brought forward several years
ago.

Price made a motion to approve Policy 1.30, School District Beliefs, Vision, Mission as presented. Wandke seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Crotty, Fielden, Romberg, Wandke, Jaensch, Fitzgerald, and Price. No: None. The motion carried.
