A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Romberg, Price, Fielden, Dennison, Weeks, Jaensch and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

Student 59765

Fielden made a motion, seconded by Dennison to impose Student Discipline on Student 59765 as discussed in Closed Session. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Weeks, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

Student 59831

Price made a motion, seconded by Fielden to impose Student Discipline on Student 59831 as discussed in Closed Session. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Weeks, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

Student 58944

Fielden made a motion, seconded by Price to rescind discipline action taken on Student 58944 as discussed in Closed Session. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Romberg, Dennison, Jaensch, Price, and Fielden. No: Crotty. Abstain: Weeks. The motion carried.

Item 14, Bus Leases

There was discussion about leasing vs. purchasing.

Price made a motion to approve the Bus Lease item as presented. Fielden seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Weeks, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

Discussion With Action: # 549

1. Resolution No, 0905-04, Resolution authorizing the issuance of \$36 Million General Obligation bonds (alternate Revenue Source).

Mr. Zager explained that this resolution authorizes the District to begin the process to issue bonds. The public is allowed to get a petition signed by 7% of the population to have a referendum to issue the bonds.

Crotty made a motion to approve Resolution No. 0905-04, Resolution authorizing the issuance of \$36 million General Obligation bonds as presented. Fielden seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Weeks, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

2. NCHS Bid Release

There was discussion about how to make this information more reader-friendly.

Tim Bickert, IHC, explained the materials. It was requested that in the future, a list of companies that picked up packets be provided and then a list from lowest bidder to highest be provided. There was discussion about the liquidated damages clause in the bid package. The contractor has a certain amount of time to perform the work and if it is not completed within that time, back charges can be assessed for the extra days. The benefit is that it gives the District some leverage to be sure the contractor finishes the work on time. It was requested that the District legal counsel review the liquidated damages clause. Fielden made a motion to approve the NCHS Bid Release as presented. Crotty seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Weeks, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

3. Recall AMPE Teachers and Elementary Enrichment Assistants Dr. Leis explained that collaborating with the administration and teachers and input from NUEA, he is recommending option C for one year for the AMPE teachers to involve them in meaningful engagement with the students while providing the team collaboration time that is currently lacking at the elementary level. He wanted to notify the teachers who have been let go the status of their jobs before they left for summer.

Fielden made a motion to approve recalling AMPE Teachers and Elementary Enrichment Assistants as presented. Price seconded the motion. Discussion followed with concern for down the road and that this issue initially came about as a cost saving measure. Dr. Leis explained that he is trying not to cut instruction and that this collaborative time is very important to the teachers. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, and Fielden. No: Crotty, Weeks, Jaensch, and Dennison. The motion failed.

4. Intergovernmental Agreement with District 204 Re: Alternative Middle School Program

Mr. Caudill explained that this program meets the needs of struggling middle school students by providing direct instruction, not computer based instruction. It can accommodate 12 - 14 students per grade level, and offers a viable alternative for expulsion in cooperation with District 204.

Dennison moved, seconded by Crotty to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with District 204 Re: Alternative Middle School Program as presented.

A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. Abstain: Weeks. The motion carried.

5. Change Order to Remediate Soil Conditions at the Early Childhood Center Site.

Mr. Fielden noted that the Board Facilities Sub Committee is recommending the change order as discussed in the committee report earlier in the meeting. Fielden moved, seconded by Crotty to approve the Change Order to Remediate Soil Conditions at the ECC site. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes: Price, Romberg, Jaensch, Dennison, Weeks, Fielden, and Crotty. No: None. The motion carried.

6. 8.06 Second Reading Policy 7.190, Student Discipline

Dr. Leis noted that the only change is to move the consequence for carrying non-prescription drugs from category three to category two which gives the administration more leeway and discretion in implementing consequences for the infraction.

Fielden made a motion, seconded by Crotty to approve the changes to Policy 7.190, Student Discipline as presented.

There was discussion about monitoring medication and the verbiage possibly conflicting with the medication distribution policy. Some Board members felt that moving the infraction to a classification two is an improvement.

Price made a motion to end the discussion. Those voting yes: Dennison, Price. No: Fielden, Crotty, Romberg, Jaensch, and Weeks. The motion failed.

Fielden made a motion to amend the language of the first motion to approve as presented but strike the words "in a quantity which exceeds one recommended dose" from the policy. Price seconded the motion. Those voting yes: Romberg, Fielden, Crotty, and Price. No: Weeks, Jaensch, and Dennison. The motion carried.

Fielden made a motion to approve the initial motion as amended. Crotty seconded the motion. Those voting yes: Romberg, Fielden, Crotty, and Price. No: Weeks, Jaensch, and Dennison. The motion carried.

First Reading Policy Updates

Dr. Leis noted that the review of policies is one of the commitments he made to the Board. He is planning to review sections 4 and 5 and he has asked Lenore Johnson to review sections 6, 7, and 8. This review will bring the policies into compliance with the law. The Board will vote on the first group of revisions at the June 15 Board meeting. Some questions were asked that Dr. Leis will look into.

Dr. Leis requested clarification regarding recalling the enrichment assistants and AMPE teachers. Some Board members requested a different or new recommendation which looks at more options. Board members are not interested in eliminating collaboration time, but are looking for the best solution and are not ready to recall the teachers at this time.

Kevin Doherty, Student Ambassador from NNHS, thanked the Board for the experience he gained as the Student Ambassador and the new perspectives he now understands. He noted that he hopes the program continues to afford the experience to other students.
