Identifies and describes 2-dimensional shapes.			
Identifies and describes 3-dimensional shapes.

Uses and shares observations of local weather conditions to describe patterns over time.			
Determines the effect of sunlight on Earth's surface and designs a structure that will reduce the warming effect of sunlight on an area.			
Plans and conducts an investigation to compare the effects of different strengths or different directions of pushes and pulls on the motion of an object.			
Analyzes data to determine if a design solution works as intended to change the speed or direction of an object with a push or a pull.			
Uses observations to describe patterns of what plants and animals (including humans) need to survive.			
Constructs an argument about how plants and animals interact with their environments.
