When considering a request for early entrance, it is important to take into account the long-term effects of moving a child ahead of his/her age level peers. Early school experiences help shape social interactions, self-confidence, and academic foundational skills. While the screening process helps predict academic success during the early years of schooling, it is impossible to predict the long-term effects for the child's future including, but not limited to, academic classroom placements, participation in extracurricular sports and activities, peer-to-peer relationships, etc. We encourage parents to carefully weigh the long-term effects before submitting an application for early entrance to kindergarten.
