Dr. Rubin's Mini-Medical School is a community service program created in 2004. Our programs are designed to encourage motivated high school students to become physicians and surgeons. The Mini Medical School for High School Students Program is a competitive program consisting of 20 hours of intense instruction during which students are provided an overview of the courses and clinics experienced at a typical medical school. Topics range from biochemistry and genetics to pediatrics and surgery. Experiences range from taking blood pressure to casting broken bones and delivering a baby. The program meets 5 times at the Edward Plainfield ER Conference Rooms in Plainfield IL and we graduate our students on our 6th session at Edward Hospital, Naperville, IL Parents are invited to the last session when students will be provided a chance to review all the procedures learned along with their parents and hear a lecture on how to obtain admission to medical school as well as other health fields. We will conclude with our graduation ceremony. Students must be able to attend all 6 sessions to fully benefit from this program.

Admission to this program is competitive. There is no fee to apply. This program is appropriate for advanced sophomores, juniors and senior students. Applications will be processed as they are received. Student finalists will be offered an interview. The deadline for us to receive a complete application is **October 31, 2018.**
