What is 4-H?

4-H Youth Development is a multi-faceted program that includes 4-H community clubs, special interest (SPIN) clubs, in-school and after-school learning opportunities, and other youth outreach activities for ages 8 to 18. 4-H also offers a Cloverbud program for youth ages 5 to 7. These positive youth development programs provide the opportunity for youth to feel a sense of belonging, develop independence, practice generosity, and experience mastery.
