Table #	Steps to support student learning in a digital world:			
1	<ol> <li>Model good behavior</li> <li>Teach examples of good/bad posts</li> <li>Empower them to learn how to discipline themselves in how they use their digital time and tools</li> <li>Re-teach them different things they need to be aware of at different stages of life (elementary vs. Jr. High vs. High School)</li> </ol>			
2	<ol> <li>Start a conversation by sharing our own digital struggles so they know they are not alone.</li> <li>We would like to model and discuss good digital behavior.</li> <li>Slow down and set boundaries and know that things really can wait.</li> <li>Focus on one thing at a time.</li> </ol>			
3	<ol> <li>Discussing the need to have followers versus friends</li> <li>Mentoring through setting the right example; doing things ourselves</li> <li>Have conversations with your children about what they are living in terms of technology</li> <li>Use examples in media and text to help start these discussions</li> <li>Asking permission to post a picture of someone</li> </ol>
