






Revenue by Source






Expenses by Fund






Per Pupil Expenditures

FOCUS 2020 is the District's strategic blueprint for comprehensive improvement between 2014 and 2020. It is emerging as the result of community feedback, best practice, and a vision for the future. Ultimately, this blueprint will advance the fulfillment of the District's mission.

The blueprint's foundation is the Future Focus Community Engagement process that occurred over the course of a year where hundreds of members from across the community provided feedback to District leadership regarding facilities, finances, measuring student success, and programs of study.

The Blueprint includes four "Strategic Focus" areas, and each Focus then establishes "Commitments" which are what the District leadership pledges to accomplish within a distinct timeframe.

Acquire up to date demographic and enrollment projections to aid leadership in allocating District resources

Greate a facility master plan that will aid leadership in allocating District resources to meet the varied needs of schools and




