










Eligibility for Bus Transportation

- The District provides bussing for all families who live 1.5 miles or more from their home school.
- In some special circumstances, families who cross streets designated as hazardous are also provided bussing.




The philosophy of the Naperville School District Dual Language Program is to educate our students to become bilingual, bi-literate, and multicultural in this ever increasing global society.

In addition to the components of the all day model, Dual Language students will experience:

- Literacy and content (Math, Science, Social Studies) learning
 in two languages throughout the whole day using the same
 curriculum as the general education classes. (In
 Kindergarten, 80% of instruction is conducted in Spanish
 with built-in language support for students who are
 learning Spanish as an additional language.)
- Opportunities to learn about the cultures of the Spanish Naperville 2)3
 and English-speaking worlds.

How can I enroll my child in Dual Language?



- Enroll your child in Kindergarten by Friday, March 21,
 2025 to be entered in the lottery
- Mark that you want your child to be considered for the Dual Language program on the enrollment form
- Lottery results will be emailed on April 11, 2025
- Younger siblings of current Dual Language students are given priority enrollment (they must be fully enrolled by March 21, 2025 as well)
- Classroom Makeup: Approximately 50% students who speak English or other languages at home and 50% students who speak Spanish at home


Math



Kindergarten Lunch



At lunch, kindergarteners...

- Have a 40 min. lunch/recess period
- May bring lunch or purchase lunch
- · Will eat in the MPR with support from staff
- Accommodations are made for students with food allergies

Helping your student prepare for eating lunch at school:

- Students should be able to eat within the allotted time.
- Students should be independent in eating and managing containers. (Staff will provide support in opening containers as needed.)

Breakfast is also provided for those who opt for that meal.

 Information about menus and purchasing school meals will come via email.

Getting to and from school



Bussing - Enter the back of the building

- Provided for families who live 1.5 miles or more from their home school
- Bus stop locations & Information available on Infinite Campus as of Aug 13

Day Care Transportation - Enter the back of the building

Provided by various businesses

Walking or Carpool Drop Off - Enter the front of the building

- Students can be designated as walkers and must be escorted to and from school by an adult
- Students can also be driven to school and dropped off in the front of the building

Arrival Procedures

AM Carpool

- Parent remains in the car we have staff to assist in the carpool lane
- Your child should sit behind the passenger for easy access to exit the car
- No cell phone use in the carpool lane

Day 1 & 2 of school

- All Kindergarten students meet in the MPR
- Teachers will meet students in the MPR and walk them to the classroom
- Ensure your child knows their teacher's name

Arrival after day 2

• Students enter the building after 8:00 AM either in the front of the building (carpool & walkers) or the back of the building (bus riders)

Late arrival - After 8:15 AM

• Must be signed in by an adult in the main office

Kindergarten Red Tote

Why?

- Safety-identify k-students
- Packing and unpacking ease
- Used for winter gear
- Can be personalized



Dismissal Procedures

- Dismissal time for Kindergarten and 1st grade students is at 2:25 PM
- Kindergarten teachers and other staff will escort students either to the buses, Champions after school care or the front for carpool and parent pickup for walkers
- Teachers will provide tags for student bags to indicate their method of transportation
- All changes in transportation must be made in writing (email or note) or via phone call to the office no later than 2:00 PM

Carpool Pickup - Front of the building

- Have your child's name displayed in your front windshield to assist with locating students
- Pull as far forward as you possibly can. We will bring your child to you :)





Health Requirements: Physical Exam

- All physical exam and immunization requirements should be fulfilled prior to the first day of school.
- Exam must be performed within 1 year prior to the first day of school.
- May be completed by licensed physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant.
- Health history portion must be completed and signe
 by parent for physical to be valid.

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Health Requirements: Immunizations

 Immunizations must be up-to-date and verified by a healthcare practitioner

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Health Requirements: Vision Exam



- The vision requirement should be fulfilled prior to the first day of school.
- Exam must be performed within 1 year prior to the first day of school
- To be completed by an licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist.

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Health Requirements: Dental Exam



- Required by May 14, 2026
- May be performed any time within the 18-month period prior to the due date (November 15, 2024-May 15, 2026).

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
