#### Admissions Information



- November 1: Early Action application deadline
- Mid December: Early Action decisions
- January 1: Regular application deadline
- February 1: Financial aid application deadline
- Late March: Regular application decisions
- May 1: Accepted student reply deadline
- May-June: Waitlist decisions if positions remain

#### Admissions Information



- Typically rank in the top 10-15% of their graduating class
- Transcript and high school profile examined closely
- "Well rounded"
- "Well lopsided"
- Unusual personal circumstances or experience
- Enthusiasm, creativity, strength of character
- Required: SAT or ACT with writing
- Required: two SAT Subject Tests
- No minimum test scores



- 2019-2020: \$73,800
- Tuition, fees, room, board, books, living expenses
- Grants and not loans
- Based on parents income and assets
- Home equity not used in financial aid calculations
- Takes into account other siblings going to college



- Admission is entirely need blind.
- Financial aid is entirely need based.
- Financial aid budget for 2016-2017 academic year: \$177 million
- Scholarship budget increased 150% in the last decade
- \$125+ million gift from Ken Griffin principally marked for financial aid

- Average scholarship: \$53,850
- 90% would pay the same or less compared to a state university
- 60% of Harvard families pay an average of \$12,000/yr
- >50% receive need-based scholarships
- 25% of students come from families earning under \$80,000
- 20% of Harvard families pay nothing at all

- Unsurpassed breadth and depth
- State-of-the-art academic facilities and laboratories
- Unmatched combination of research centers, institutes and graduate schools
- World's largest university library system

### Academics



- 49 concentrations
- Over 3,500 courses
- May combine two concentrations or design their own
- Concentration requirement are no more than half a student's academic program
- Shopping period for courses
- 7:1 student/faculty ratio
- Average class size 20
- Median class size is 12
- Rarely are courses denied due to oversubscription
- Cross registration at Harvard graduate schools and MIT

### Academics



- New Gen Ed program
- Four categories: Aesthetics and Culture; Histories, Societies, Individuals; Science and Technology in Society; and Ethics and Civics
- Three divisions: Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences, and Sciences or Engineering
- Quantitative Reasoning with Data requirement
- May take half of them pass/fail
- Meant to simplify Gen Ed requirements and give wider array of options to fulfill
- No more Advanced Standing
- New Concurrent Degree Program

- \$7 million available for undergraduate research
- Fosters close relationships with faculty and mentors
- Career and personal development
- Harvard Innovation Lab
- Harvard Life Lab
- Human ArtLab

## Study Abroad



- Expanded study abroad opportunities
- 66% of students enjoy an international experience
- Generous funding available
- \$100 million gift has dramatically expanded experiences
- Nearly 500 students aided by this gift during the past year

### Community



- Specially designed freshman year living in historic Harvard Yard
- Residential House system creates home away from home
- 97% of students live on campus
- Personal advising for each student on all aspects of college life
- Close faculty-student collaboration in research and coursework
- Over 450 extracurricular activities
- Foster life long friendships among its student and faculty
- Active and involved alumni association

## Freshman Program



- 100% of freshman live on campus
- Roommates chosen by Assistant Dean of Freshmen
- After first year, roommates choose each other
- Harvard Yard
- Take meals together in Annenberg Hall

- 1:3 freshman/adviser ratio





#### Interview Format
