What are the hours of e-Learning?

- We will have attendance and agendas posted on Canvas by 9:00 AM.
- Students need to make sure they have checked in on the attendance form by 2:00 for EACH class that has a Canvas page. Do this EVERY day that e-Learning is scheduled.

What do I do if I get stuck on an assignment?

1. Re-read the directions. Then, read them again.
2. Look back at the agenda or other information (teacher samples, due dates, etc.) posted on Canvas.
3. Ask a classmate. (Note: If you haven't reached out to someone to be an accountability buddy, you might consider doing that!)
4. Email your teacher and be as specific as possible. We are here to help!
