Principal's Report - Bill Wiesbrook, Principal

- Most unusual year due to covid-19; Difficult to teach in person and on zoom simultaneously.
- 70% of students are in building; 94% of staff fully vaccinated.
- Parents and students will make personal decision whether or not to get vaccinated.
- District 203/204 trying to make vaccine convenient to students. Available at Neuqua in May and second shot in June.
- Using block schedule currently due to no more than 50 allowed in cafeteria.
- First time ever where all students leave campus for lunch, working well.
- Possibility that open campus for lunch in future based on IDPH guidelines.
- Block schedule likely will not continue next year.
- Next year, every student expected in building except documented medical.
- August 19, 2021, will be the first day of school next year.
- 4.0 Celebration was done virtually due to limited seating in cafeteria.
- High school summer school starts in June. All students eligible to take one summer school course for free. Courses can be found on the website.
- Expect athletic activities to get back to normal next year.
- Next year, the "close contact' quarantining may change due to students being vaccinated.
- This year, remote students can still do athletics. Typically, cannot participate in sports if miss school.

Dean of Student Activities Report - Lynne Nolan

- Holding two ceremonies for graduates this year. Stadium cannot accommodate 330 students in addition to their parents. Students can choose which ceremony they prefer.
- Trying to organize as many of the traditional events students have come to expect.
- Choral, orchestra, band and mini drum show are able to do performances in theater.
- Mr. NCHS scheduled for May 21. Seating limited. Plan to sell tickets for inside.
 If weather permits will be held outside and additional tickets will be sold at the door.
- Musical will be post-graduation.
- Senior spirit days and slushies for seniors.
- Putting on scavenger hunt for frosh/soph.
- LINK training will be hybrid (in school and remote training).

- Multi-cultural club will broadcast performance.
- Subscribe to NCHS Athletics on YouTube and can see multiple sports simultaneously.
- Prom will be held in two groups for two hours each.
