 - A few ideas being explored to help with the shortfall. 1) Sell hard copies of Parent Guide at the upcoming Freshman Jamboree along with bake sale (goodies sponsored by DeEtta's), 2) Restaurant Fundraiser at Front Street Cantina in the form of a friendly month-long competition against Naperville Central, 3) see if any nearby gas stations will donate a portion of their sale, (Naperville Central gets a donation of a cent per gallon sold at the nearby Shell station), 4) a raffle for preferred seating/parking during graduation.

Committee Reports

EKG Screening: Scheduled for Thursday, March 12, 2020. Volunteer sign up is now open at the following link https://signup.com/go/LUMpDsu. We will need over 200 volunteers to make this screening possible. There are morning and afternoon shifts. Lunch will be provided for volunteers who work all day. Volunteer training is required and will occur on the evening of March 11, 2020. Please sign up to help out! The goal this year is to screen at least 80% of our students. The screening is free, but students do need to be signed up by their parents. Information and a link to on-line sign up have been sent out through PE classes and the Huskie Howler at the beginning of second semester.

72% of the students were tested in 2016-17. The goal for this year is to test 80% of the students. Volunteers need not have prior medical training. Only adults can volunteer, but they need not be a current parent. Retired friends and neighbors are welcome to help out. Volunteers have to attend a refresher course, if they haven't taken the training within the last two years.

Nominations: Kim Henderson contacting current chairs now. Secretary position will be open. A nominations committee will be formed if there is more than one candidate for the Secretary position.

Guest speakers - Testing by Judy McCormack & Carrie Ray

- On Tuesday, April 14th, juniors will be taking the State SAT and sophomores will take the PSAT 10. On Wednesday, April 15th, freshmen would take the PSAT 8/9. For those taking the exam on Wednesday, it will not be a late start. Juniors and sophomores do not have school on Wednesday. No registration is required to appear for these tests
- SAT timings are from 7:45 am to 1:15 pm. Students can enter up to 4 college codes for free. It is mandatory for graduation.
- Sophomores will not enter any college code. Lunch is available for purchase on that day and busses will run as usual.

- College Board account is mandatory. Students are recommended to set up the account using their student id and change to their personal one once they go to college. Sophomores will open their account during the Crew 2 sessions.
- SAT Khan Academy is a great resource for taking SAT practice tests. Based on the uploaded PSAT scores, students will get free, personalized practice tests. For those prepping for ACT, ACT academy is a good resource.
- Superscoring will be an option for ACT from September 2020, but it is best to check with colleges about their policy on superscoring.
- AP Testing is scheduled from May 4th May 15th.
- Earlier the College Board was sued for selling student information. Now the parents need to approve this information and provide consent by March 1st, for both SAT and PSAT 10. If a consent form is not provided, it will be assumed as a denial. If students share their phone number by mistake, parents can talk to College Board and have it removed.
- Students took the PSAT in October 2019. It is mainly a practice for the actual SAT but also makes students eligible for National Merit Scholarship. The results are on the College Board website. Students and parents can see the analysis of their test as well as AP recommendations on the site.
- Illinois Science assessment is scheduled for Tuesday, March 10, 2020 and the make-up test is on Thursday, March 19, 2020. It is mandatory for juniors. During that time, freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will have their science classes in the auditorium. The test has 3 sections and approximately 40 minutes long. Students will be asked to bring their Chromebooks fully charged.

Administration Reports

Events/ Happenings: Jen Baumgartner

- Getting ready for Senior Mailer, Cap and Gown, and spring activities.
- Jazz, chess, show choir and robotics seasons are ramping up.

- Students who are involved in activities and getting failing grades have been put on a watch list. Letters have been sent out offering support. - Jen will be meeting with School Store parents to figure out the inventory system.
