Executive Board Reports

 - General Home & School:
 - District Calendar discussions for 2020-21 and 2021-22 are underway
 - There are 3 main criteria: Semesters to be balanced (no more than 8 days discrepancy between semesters), semester exams before winter break, and to start the school as late as possible.
 - Considering having no school on election day because of security challenges.
 - Considering fall break, around election day.
 - The draft proposal to be presented to the BOE by October 21st and final approval by Thanksgiving in November.
 - Communication process in the event of an emergency and how to keep parents updated.

Partner Reports

SFCP: The Parent-to-Parent College Information panel is scheduled for October 29th from 7 pm to 8:30 pm.

Guest speaker - Brian LaPorte on College Information/SchooLinks

• College & Career Center is located in the Learning Commons. Ms. Monica Novak is away on leave and Carol Krashen will be the long-term substitute. 200+ unique college visits have been planned during Fall 2019.

- Senior College Parent Information Night was at the beginning of the year. Seniors are currently going through the application process.
- Financial Aid Night was in September, presented by the College of DuPage representative. College reps visit the school, from November through April. Students can drop in during their lunch periods.
- Evening programs with college reps have already started, and other schools(204, Benet, Naperville Central) can attend as well. College Planning Night scheduled for February 2nd.
- Junior week presentations scheduled from April 20 April 24. It was piloted last year and went very well.
- Naviance was the go-to site for the last 10 years and will be replaced by SchooLinks. Current Seniors will continue using Naviance. Site will be shutdown during November/December for letters of recommendations/transcripts to be sent out.
- SchooLinks is aligned with the College Readiness curriculum. Fall school registration will be done through SchooLinks. Students are already signed on to SchooLinks. An email with the link will be sent later this week to the parents of freshmen, sophomores, and juniors.
- SchooLinks will be available for grades 6 through 12. 8th graders will register for high school classes through the website.
- Working on the idea of a Career Carnival using altered schedules so students can listen to speakers without missing classes.

Q&A

- The pros and cons of SchooLinks vs Naviance is yet to be seen. SchooLinks portal is still in development and offers more features to align with the College Readiness curriculum.
- The order in which the colleges receive documents does not matter, as long as the deadlines are met.
- Colleges need test scores from College Boards. Students can send in test scores as soon as they know. After October/November, servers can become slower. So it is recommended that students don't wait till the end.
- Recommendation letters depend on the each college requirements. 1 or 2 may be sufficient. Some colleges are specific about requirements and not all colleges ask for one. Counselor recommendations, again, depends on the college.
- Some colleges request self-reporting of test scores. ACT charges \$13 to send in the scores. Some colleges allow self-reporting of scores to stop price gouging. These colleges require official scores to be reported from the ACT once the student has been accepted.
- Some colleges make test scores optional, believing that a 4-hour standardized testing isn't a snapshot of the student's work. Merit scholarships are also offered without test scores.
- Information for each college can be found in Naviance/SchooLinks. Students need to organize that information. (An excel spreadsheet template will be shared on the website along with the presentation)
