- > Rankings and reputation
- > What does a "good college" mean?
- > Comparison to others
- > After college?



College Search

> Reach / Target / Safety Schools

So...how many should I apply to?

- > Varies by student!
- > Average 5-8 applications (app fee + test scores)
- > Far Reach & Dream Schools?
 - Have back-up Plans B, C, and D





Generate a Plan

- > Explore Colleges & Develop Your List
 - Use <u>SchooLinks</u>
 - Keep Lines of Communication Open
- > Know How You Compare
 - Use <u>Scattergrams</u> in SchooLinks
 - Be realistic (Reach / Target / Safety)
 - Affordability/cost

Apprenticeships/Trades


- > On the job training, lasts from 1-6 years depending on the trade
- No debt from college and can work your way up in a company or start your own

Military


- Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (A.S.V.A.B.)
 - Career Exploration Program includes multiple aptitude tests and interest inventories
 - O Tests administered in October/November
- > AirForce
- > Army
- > Army National Guard
- > Coast Guard
- > Marines
- > Navy
