Early Decision

BINDING

Students make a commitment to a first choice college. If admitted under Early Decision, the student must attend.

Restrictive Early Action

NON-BINDING

Students apply to a school of preference, and receive an earlier decision. Students may be restricted from applying ED or EA to other schools

Early Action / Priority

NON-BINDING

Students apply early to a school or schools, and receive an earlier decision, ahead of the regular decision deadline

Regular Decision

NON-BINDING

Last possible deadline a student can apply and still be considered for admission to a university.

Rolling Admission

NON-BINDING

Schools review applications as they are submitted, and issue admission decisions on a rolling basis.



Visiting Colleges

- There is great value in seeing a college in person!
- Check a school's Admissions Office website about upcoming visit opportunities.
- Make sure if you visit a campus, you make it "official"
 - Either take an official tour from Admissions, or visit the Admissions Office to let them know you are on campus (Demonstrated Interest)

 - Received a MAJOR overhaul in 2023-24 School Year
 - · Will not be available until October 1, 2025

Social / Emotional Support



- Encourage your student(s) during postsecondary planning and research
- Be supportive and communicate openly with your student(s)
- Be patient with your student(s) throughout this process - this takes time





Every college/university has their own set of requirements for admission

Follow their directions carefully

- Schools look to see how well you follow directions
- Don't send more, unless a school asks for more
- Reach out to the college directly if you need clarification

Check the Letter of Rec Requirements

- **DO NOT** ask for a letter of rec if your schools do not need a letter
- **DO NOT** ask for more letters than a school requires



- Make sure you submit your applications early
 - On-time is too late
- Make sure you submit all necessary documents
 - Transcript
 - Test Scores (SAT, ACT, etc.) if required
 - Letters of Recommendation (ONLY if needed)
- Make sure to thank those who write you a letter of rec.
