- All administrators could be not be present for introductions because of the SOS screening. No new staff. Jessica Freed is taking on a new role as Assistant Principal Student Services. There has been a realignment of student services with an added Instructional Coordinator of Counseling.
- Vaping numbers are on the rise overall compared to other substance abuse problems. But they have gone down at Naperville North after strict implementation of student discipline policies.
- SOS screening has started again this year and more students are willing to talk about friends struggling.
- We won against Naperville Central in soccer. Girls cross-country and tennis are underway.

Guest speaker - Brian LaPorte and Judy McCormack on AP Testing

- Administered by college board during the first 2 weeks in May. Dates are pre-determined by college board. 2020 AP dates are on the website and cannot be change unless the student has two exams at the same time.
- Exam is optional but it offers students the option of potential college credit. Colleges decide whether AP credits will be offered. Students can look up AP credit policy search on the College Board website, and can decide depending on college policy.
- 2020 AP exam will again be held on-site at NNHS, same as the last 2 years. Students will be notified of their specific testing locations later.
- The cost is \$98 per exam.
- AP test registration moved to Fall. Registration period for 1st semester and all year exams August 15th November 7th registration. Spring registration in only for semester 2 courses.
- Late fees and cancellation fees are \$40 per exam.
- 2019 quick facts: 32 AP exams were offered. 717 students registered to take one or more exams, resulting in a total of more than 1500 exams administered. Largest exam was AP with 208 students and the smallest was AP Human Geography with one student.

Q&A

- All teachers were given codes for registration to be shared with the students. If the student doesn't have one, they can stop by main office or register.
- AP Physics C has 2 exams with \$98 each, but student can take one or the other.
- Colleges are moving away from SAT & ACT because of economic reasons, preparation & testing site availability. 4 years of proven track record is more reliable.
