

Naperville North High School Home & School Meeting Tuesday, September 11, 2018

Call to order at 9:00 am by Mary King.

Introductions: The Executive Board, the chairs, and the guest parents introduced themselves, followed by the school leadership team.

Guest presentation: Stephanie Posey

Signs of Suicide (SOS) presentation:

- A year ago, Elyssa's Mission, a foundation that provides help, support and suicide prevention programs, met with the school & the district. The goal is to be proactive in preventing any tragedies in the future, by looking at the culture at the school and devising strategies & coping mechanisms to help the students.
- All freshmen, except for the 7 who opted out, were screened from September 6th through 12th. Emails were sent to the parents with information on the parent portal and strategies that parents could use, including local resources and talking points.
- At-risk students were identified for further screening. Students were also given suggestions on how to
 access resources if they knew someone who needed help. There has been increase in the Tip203
 messages and more referrals have been made.
- Sophomores will be screened in October, Juniors in February, and Seniors in April.
- The screening will be administered at the middle school level as well.
- Everyone in the building, including custodians and cafeteria staff, have been trained by the Elyssa's Mission program covering topics such as risk factors and how to identify students who need help. A refresher training will be conducted in January, after the holidays.
- Resources available: social workers, school psychologists, peer groups with similar issues, or Linden Oaks.

Executive Functioning Task Force Planning Guide presentation:

- Last year, the teachers listed 20 Executive Functioning deficit areas where the students needed help.
- Introduced in the first semester, it is teacher-created and teacher-driven.
- Students will learn the base skills across curriculum and apply in other subjects as well.
- Next year, the new freshmen will receive the base skills, while sophomores will be taught advanced skills, juniors test prep skills, and seniors will learn about self-advocacy.
- Tier 1 intervention will be administered to all students. If Tier 1 intervention doesn't work, students will be referred to Tier 2 intervention.

- The key is to be proactive, instead of being reactive. In the past, the lunchtime sessions offered by school psychologists were voluntary and not all students attended those sessions.
- The program will be introduced at the junior high level, so it will be easier on the students when they get to high school.
- Chart/modules will be online before the end of first semester.
