- Fundraiser update: We would like to increase our wish list funding. Parent Guide for 2020 is being updated. We are planning to try and sell advanced copies during Freshman Jamboree. Front Street Cantina will support us during Taco Tuesdays. We have contacted the BP gas station at Washington & Ogden to see if they will support us with a spirit pump, where a certain percentage of sales from that pump will be given to North. EKG Screening: Scheduled for Thursday, March 12, 2020. Volunteer sign up is now open at the following link <u>https://signup.com/go/LUMpDsu</u>.

Volunteers are still needed. Training is scheduled on Wednesday evening. Those who have not attended training can help in other areas. Coffee is being arranged through Aramark and lunch through Jimmy Johns. 1,451 students out of 2,700 have registered for testing. Today is the last date to registered. Those who have not registered online can obtain a phone consent.

- All concerns have been shared with the district and SchooLinks. Monthly calls are held with SchooLinks and they are making improvements based on our suggestions.
- College App process will be done through this for seniors next year.

Guest speaker presentation - Registration by Jay Wachtel

- Registration will happen for 2 days Thursday, August 13 (Freshmen & Juniors) and Friday, August 14 (Sophomores & Seniors).
- Students who cannot attend these 2 days will be able register on August 19, the day the school starts.
- Link Leaders will be meet with freshmen on Friday.
- New Chromebooks will be issued only to freshmen.
- Online Annual Update will be out in April.
- Photos are likely to be taken during PE periods.

Guest speaker presentation - Alive Center by Diane McAroy

- Services students 6th grade through 12th grade
- Teen-led, Teen-driven
- Teen programs offer high school mentoring, tutoring K-12, Dare to be Rare for grades 5-8
- Adopt Alive program, reaches out to the community to sponsor snacks for a month.
- Summer school drop-off programs are available from 12 pm to 5 pm. About 60 high school students (30 from NCHS and 30 from NNHS) are involved in this. STEM programs are offered to Junior High students.
- STEAM camp is being offered during spring break.

Administration Reports

Events/ Happenings: Jen Baumgartner

- Senior mailers have been sent out.
- Spring week activities are scheduled next week. Air Band is on Thursday, March 19th. Spring Dance is on Saturday, March 21st. Volunteers are still needed.
- Robotics and Show Choir are off to state.

Principal Report: Stephanie Posey

- Coronavirus update:
 - Working with the district.
 - Extra care being taken because we have multi-needs and medically fragile students.
 - Additional cleaning began in November with the onset of flu season.
 - Hand sanitizers with alcohol have been added.
 - Additional cleaning and sanitizing is done during weekends.
 - Students are encouraged to practice safe coughing methods and better hygiene.
 - Following the best practices suggested by CDC. If anyone has traveled to other countries, they are encouraged to self-quarantine.

- There have been 4 fights this school year including the one in last week. Less than 60 students have been suspended (all issues) and for less than 3 days. Social media is more disruptive than compassion-ate. Students can report any issues using Tip203.
- Vaping:
 - 2 speakers this year.
 - One student was hospitalized due to respiratory issues.
 - Affecting all students from all sections and interests.
 - These are not just regular cartridges, but THC-infused and tend to look like USBs.
 - Vape detectors have been installed in a few bathrooms. When vape is detected, a text is sent to a group of administrators. Cartridges are getting flushed in the bathrooms
 - Students have been caught vaping while waiting for buses.
 - Last year, 40-45 students were suspended overall. This year, the number has increased because of vaping.
 - The Parent Handbook will be updated to reflect any vaping related rules.
- School Improvement Plan will be presented to the BoE in April and the powerpoint will be shared during the next H&S meeting.
- SEL focus will continue on building relationships and executive functioning. Students will be encouraged to practice self-advocacy and note-taking skills. Each student will be exposed during different classes. Professional Learning Communities will work on SEL standards. Tier 2 students who don't perform at adequate standards will be identified. Teachers will talk about these students during the PLCs on Wednesday mornings. Literacy & Science skills will include reading & interpreting graphs and command & evidence. Realignment of academic support will help the bottom quartile. Behavioral (non-PLC) trends and grades will also be considered. Students who do extra curricular activities will get study hall opportunities.

A motion to adjourn was made at by Diana McClaurin and seconded by Cathie Bucek. All in favor. Motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 10:55 a.m.
